2020 LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY DECLARATION
COVID-19
MAY 16 EXTENSION

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2019, the Canyon County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) approved a Canyon County Emergency Operations Plan (April 2019 Plan); and

WHEREAS, such Plan, along with the provisions of Idaho Code Chapter 10, Title 46, provides a process designed to facilitate local disaster emergency response efforts; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Governor Brad Little proclaimed the existence of a public health emergency related to the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) throughout the State of Idaho, thereby activating disaster response and recovery aspects of state, local, and intergovernmental disaster emergency plans; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, after normal business hours and with the knowledge and approval of the full BOCC, the Acting Chair of the Board declared a local disaster emergency pursuant to Idaho Code § 46-1011, in order to supplement the Governor's statewide proclamation and further ensure that the full range of potential response and recovery aspects of any state, local, and intergovernmental disaster emergency plans (including the Canyon County Plan described above) would be available to Canyon County for the furnishing of aid and assistance, and application for additional resources as needed. Such declaration was immediately given prompt and general publicity, and thereafter recorded (2020-014500) the morning of March 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the BOCC unanimously approved a 30-day extension of that declaration. Such declaration was immediately given prompt and general publicity, and recorded (2020-014989); and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, after "community spread" of COVID-19 had developed in parts of Idaho, Governor Little amended his March 13 proclamation, finding a condition of extreme peril beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of any city or county existed, and accordingly proclaimed a state of extreme emergency; and

WHEREAS, that same day of March 25, 2020, Governor Little ordered the Director of the Department of Health and Welfare to issue a statewide order for the residents of Idaho to self-isolate and "stay at home", with certain limited exceptions for essential services; and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2020, Governor Little ordered certain amendments to that stay at home order designed, among other things, to allow non-essential businesses to re-open for curbside/delivery service while maintaining other measures to protect the public health, and extended the duration of the order to April 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2020, the BOCC extended the County's declaration of emergency an additional 30 days, to expire at 11:59 p.m. on May 16; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2020, Governor Little issued a “stay healthy” order and established a four stage approach to “reopening” Idaho to intended to progressively lift restrictions over time (Stage 1: May 1 May 15; Stage 2: May 16-May 29; Stage 3: May 30 – June 12; Stage 4: June 13 – June 26) assuming certain data driven criteria are met; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 46-1011 provides for the continuation and renewal of a local declaration for a period in excess of seven (7) days upon the formal consent of a Board majority; and

WHEREAS, a local emergency declaration must be filed with the Canyon County Recorder and "given prompt and general publicity."

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Canyon County Commissioners does hereby declare:

That the local disaster emergency declared on March 19, 2020, has not abated and the community spread of COVID-19 in Canyon County has led to loss of life; that there is ongoing risk to life and operation of local public infrastructure as a result of the established community spread of COVID-19 in Canyon County; and that a local disaster emergency therefore continues to exist and that all efforts may be made to protect the citizens and property of the County of Canyon through continued activation of all local disaster emergency plans and state emergency assistance;

That this Declaration shall expire at 11:59 p.m. on June 15, 2020, unless the BOCC expressly authorizes the continuance or termination of such Declaration; and

That this Declaration shall be promptly filed with the Canyon County Recorder's Office; and

That prompt and general publicity shall be given by a press release notifying the public of this Declaration.
